Instructions for authors

Caucasian Entomological Bulletin (ISSN 1814-3326) is published by the Southern Scientific Centre of the Russian Academy of Sciences (Rostov-on-Don, Russia), in Russian or English languages, 2 times (2 issues) a year. The journal accepts manuscripts on diverse aspects of entomology especially on morphology, systematics, phylogeny, and evolution.

All manuscripts are peer reviewed.

Manuscripts must be submitted as a Word (doc, docx) or RTF file containing text and tables. The common font Times New Roman (12 pt) must be used for the main text.

Authors must adhere to the International Code of Zoological Nomenclature (4th edition 1999).

All names of the zoological genera and species, when mentioned for the first time in the text of the paper must be provided with full author(s) name(s) and the year of publication. Use *italics* only for the zoological generic and specific Latin names.

Use **bold** for such abbreviations as **sp. n.**, **syn. n.**, **comb. n.**, **stat. n.**, **stat. resurr.**, etc., for marking new nomenclatural acts.

Please conform to the recommended **structure of the manuscript**:

1. Title.

2. Name(s) of all authors.

3. Author's contact details (usually name and postal address of the institution(s) in which author(s) work, and e-mail addresses) as follows:

All literature cited in the text must be listed in the references in the following format (note: journal titles must be written in full, not abbreviated).

Colour printing may be exceptionally allowed by the Editor-in-Chief, when colour is imperative to highlight the information in a figure.
